Amy Owens - Blending Families Panel additional note

THE RAW TRUTH:

I've been struggling a little bit to put things into words, all the things. I believe that if we're in a blended family, due to divorce, then it's messy and outside of God's plan. I know the Lord can redeem all things. Not all divorces are necessarily something that we did wrong, But the result is similar.

Looking back, I wish we would've prepared our children better before we married. We cannot go back and do it again, but I would advise people to really take the time to prepare their children the best you can. Starting traditions with the new family. There's a lot of sharing in blended families. There's a lot of moving parts with ex-spouses involved. There's usually a reason why they are ex spouses. it's always best to keep thoughts to ourselves and not share them about ex spouses. That was not always easy for me to do in the beginning.

I'm so thankful that I was able to come alongside of Nick and help raise his children. I do love them the same as my own. My children, however have not appreciated my new life, I'm sure it's hard for them share their mom. I'm also thankful that Asher had Nick come alongside of him and raise him. It's always a hard concept as God calls us to honor our spouse before our children. But when your mother, or a father, you become very protective of your children. My son went from being raised with four sisters, and myself to being thrown in with a bunch of alpha males. Very difficult. The boys really did not like each other at first. Nick's children seemed to take to me a little bit easier. And today the boys are great friends. I also adore his daughters and our grand daughters. The boys were back-and-forth with visitation every other week, and that was a challenge. Mack was here for more extended periods of time.

We've been to counselors that have been extremely committed to biblical truths through our marriage. When you've been through divorce and trauma, you bring that into the marriage. So it's a lot of work.

I have no doubt that God planned for all of this, and that we were with in Gods will. We practiced purity with each other before marriage, as we wanted to set an example for our children.

Each of them have their own deep stories. I pray that all of them will fall in love with Jesus.

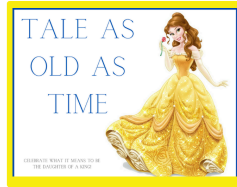

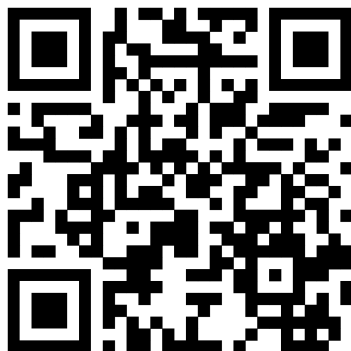
